## **MARCH 7, 1965 DEAD LINE FOR PAYING 1965 DUES**

In accordance with our constitution and by-laws dues for the ensuing year are payable on December 7 and become delinquent on March 7 the following year which is a period of 90 days after the due date. Our dues are only \$6 per year which is just about as low as it possibly could be and still operate a national organization. Available at no charge to the member are unit lists and the quarterly publication the Pearl Harbor-Gram, we are furthering the purposes of our association in honoring our dead and keeping the memory of Pearl Harbor alive before the general public. It is hoped that you will forward \$6 for your 1965 dues if you have not already done so and that you will not cause the national office to be forced with the unhappy task of removing your name from the roster and of course from the unit list.

After March 7th a reinstatement fee of \$5.00 must be charged in addition to the \$6 annual dues. This is not a mere penalty but is intended to cover the cost of work involved in removing a name from the Master Alphabetical File, State File, Unit File, Dues accounting Record, Application for membership File, etc. and then when the dues are paid this work must be again repeated to place a member in good standing in the proper files.

## **ATTENTION ALL MEMBERS**

Late in October and also in November, of 1964, a mailing was made by some unknown person or persons to many of our members of a publication called "None Dare Call it Treason" and other material. In each case the inside of the book contained a stamp which our association had recently issued for a fund raising activity which was "Remember Pearl Harbor". The national office received many complaints about this mailing and inquiries as to whether it was sanctioned by the national office or was it actually sent out by the national office. I wish to make it definitely clear to all of our members that this mailing was not sponsored by the national office and the national office had no knowledge of this being done until a copy was received personally by the President Gene Lindsey and of course then other complaints were starting to come into the national office.

It is hoped that the person who was responsible for this mailing will not repeat such mailings in the future and that if it is anyone's desire to get a communication to our members that they do so through proper channels and that they identify the sender. I wish to make it very clear to our membership that our association is not engaged in any political activities so far as the national office is concerned and I assure you that we are not interested in any publications unless it deals with the attack.

## **FLORIDA TO BE SITE OF 1965 NATIONAL REUNION AND MEMORIAL SERVICE**

The National Executive Board has recently voted to change the location of the 1965 National Reunion and Memorial Service from the State of Nevada to the State of Florida. The reason for this change is that we have only about 7 members in the entire State of Nevada and knowing the many details which must be handled locally for a national reunion it seemed in the best interest of all concerned to have the 1965 reunion in the State of Florida. Further details regarding the exact city in which this will be held and other information will be forthcoming in the next Pearl Harbor-Gram. This change is not intended to minimize the deep feeling we have for those members in Nevada but since many of you are now acquainted with the work involved in state reunions, which many of you held in 1964, you will realize this was a necessary change.

## **CAREER MILITARY PERSONNEL**

Some inquiries have been received by the national office requesting information as to the status of getting free transportation for men who were career military personnel and are now on retirement. It is our understanding that there is a provision for some free travel for these retired men. However, you should contact either the Fleet Reserve Association or a similar organization for retired Army personnel and find out the exact details since the national office is not in a position to handle these matters for the individuals.

## Dave Montgomery Receives Special Gift

### A SPECIAL NOTE OF APPRECIATION FROM DAVE MONTGOMERY, PRESIDENT OF CENTRAL ILLINOIS

Words cannot begin to express my appreciation and the honor of being presented a hand-tooled gavel, anvil & carrying case made completely by hand using souvenirs from the Japanese attack December 7, 1941, from Mr. Guy Cross, Vice-President of Quincy.

A president alone cannot do his job without the support of each and every member, and would like them to know that on such an occasion as I experienced when receiving this gavel and anvil, their assistance and continued interest in our Post has made the many hours spent worthwhile.

The best words to describe this gift are those in the note received with it from Mr. Cross which I quote:

"The gavel head is made from a piece of the Monkey Pod tree which grows in Hawaii. The anvil is made of American Oak native. The piece of metal surrounding the handle is a piece of shrapnel which fell on Pearl Harbor, December 7, 1941, and is one of several pieces I obtained on that infamous day. The black spot on the anvil represents the black day of the attack. The red spot represents the red ball so famous, or infamous, marking on the planes so many of us watched all during the long days of the war. So I hope every time the gavel strikes the anvil, it represents Hawaii and the U.S. striking back at the enemy; also, shrapnel is still raining down, and may it all help us to remember Pearl Harbor

May God grant us the privilege of never seeing another day like December 7, 1941. This small token was made entirely by hand by myself and is given to Dave Montgomery to show in a small way the appreciation of us all for his hard work and many hours spent to get Post No. 2 of Illinois Chapter of Pearl Harbor Survivors Association underway. Good luck Dave!

The carrying case is lined with foam rubber and made of walnut with a mulberry handle. On the inside top lid the above description of the gavel and anvil has been described and sworn to by Mr. Cross and notarized so that authenticity will never be doubted. On the bottom of the anvil is inscribed, "Best of luck Dave - Made by C. Guy Cross August 1964."

### LAPEL PINS

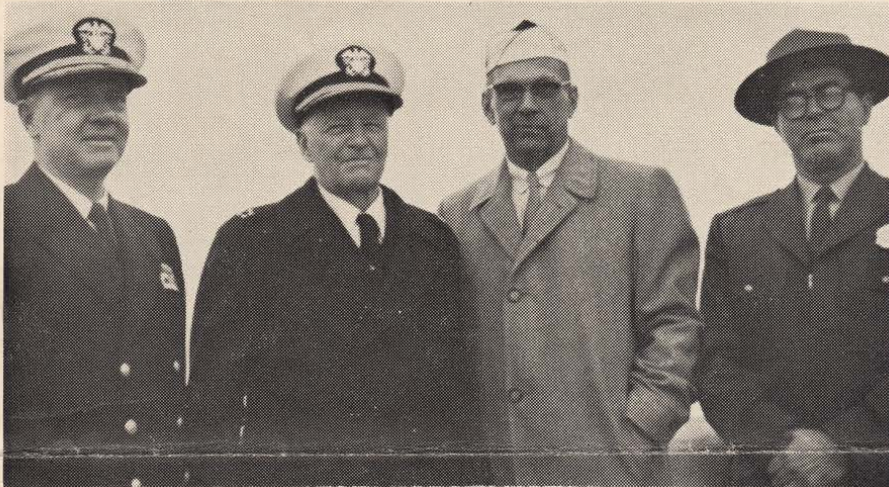
