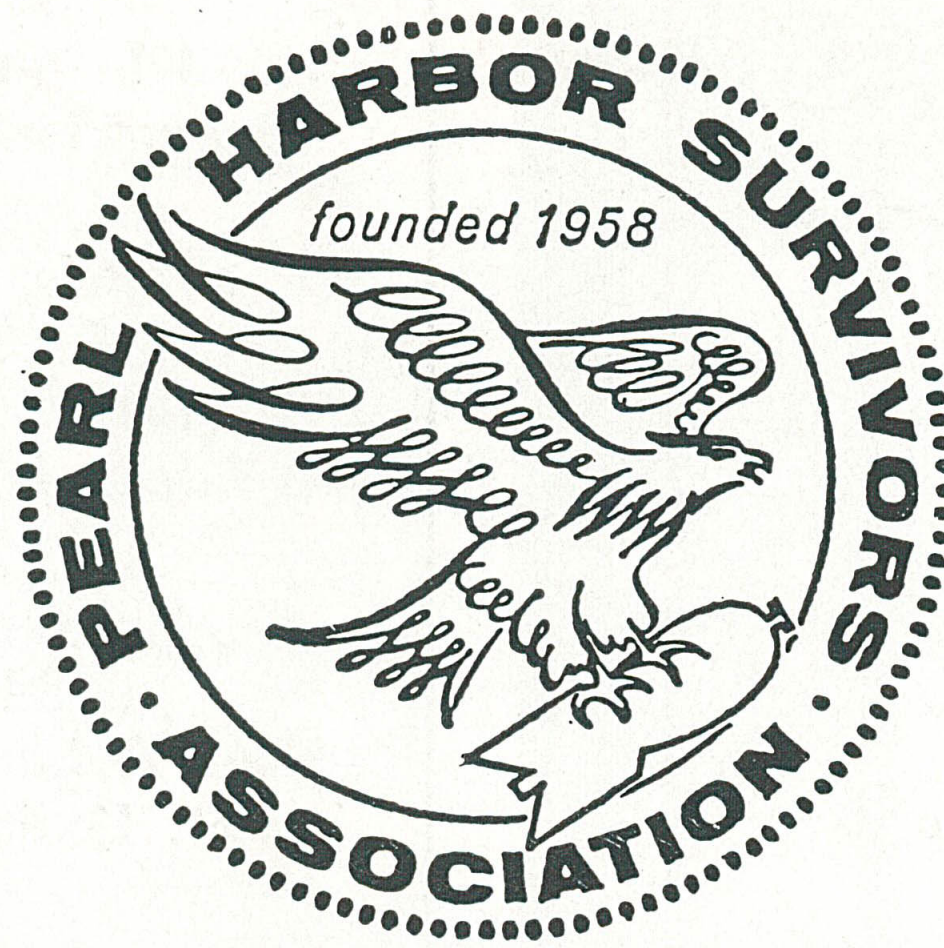

The bell? It is the ship's bell from the USS Phoenix - a light cruiser of the Brooklyn "bobtail" type - and one of the few who "got away and lived to fight another day" on that Sunday morning, December 7, 1941.

The Class of 1962 of Carl Hayden High School in Phoenix adopted "Project Bell" as their class project. With the assistance of Senior Senator Carl Hayden of Arizona, Charlotte Bauer, class secretary, and many others, the ship's bell of the USS Phoenix was obtained and presented to the Carl Hayden High School on October 19, 1962.

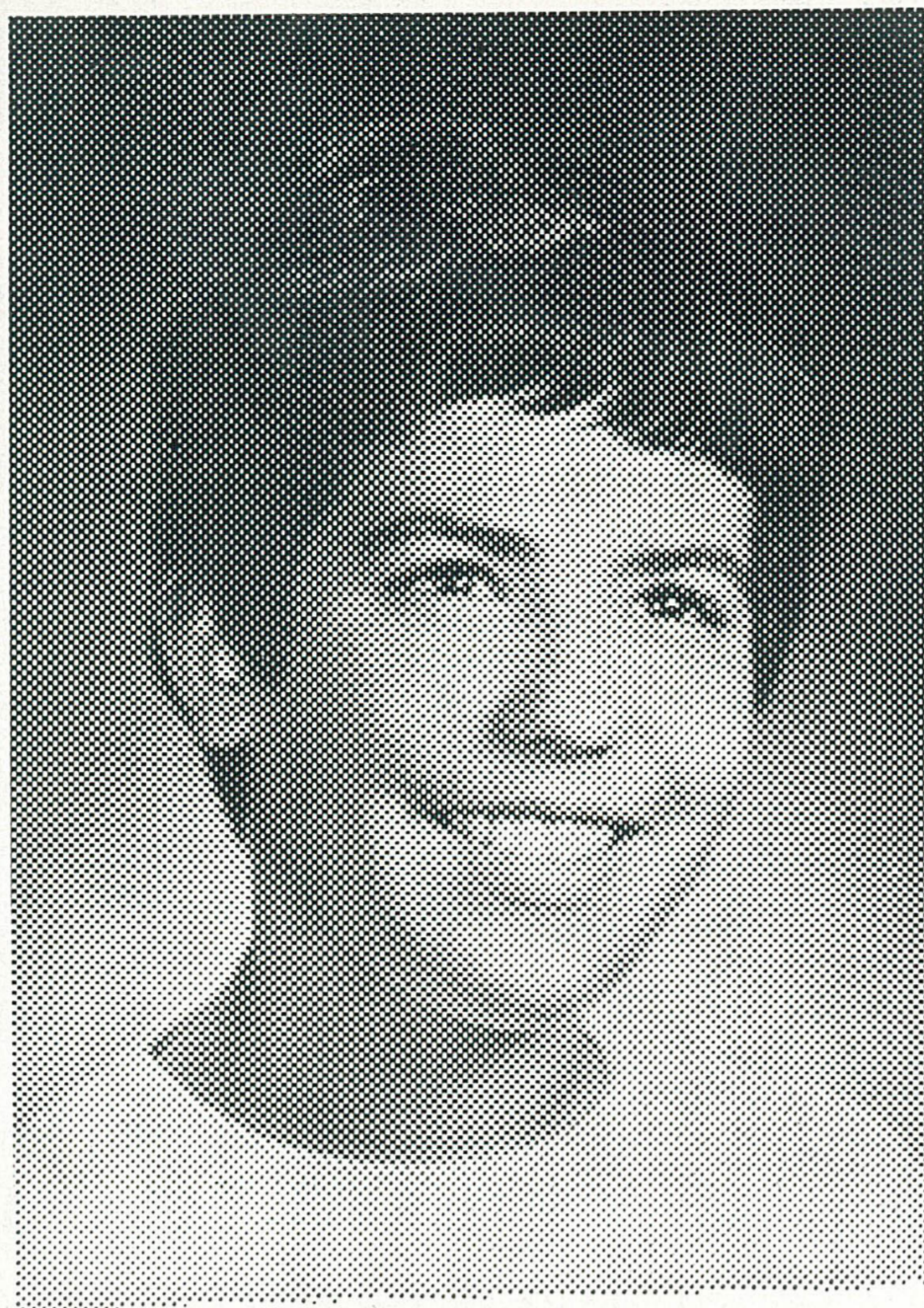
A scholarship would help a lot and I would be greatly indebted to The Seattle Chapter of the Pearl Harbor Survivors Association.

Business meeting was good and a fruitful one.

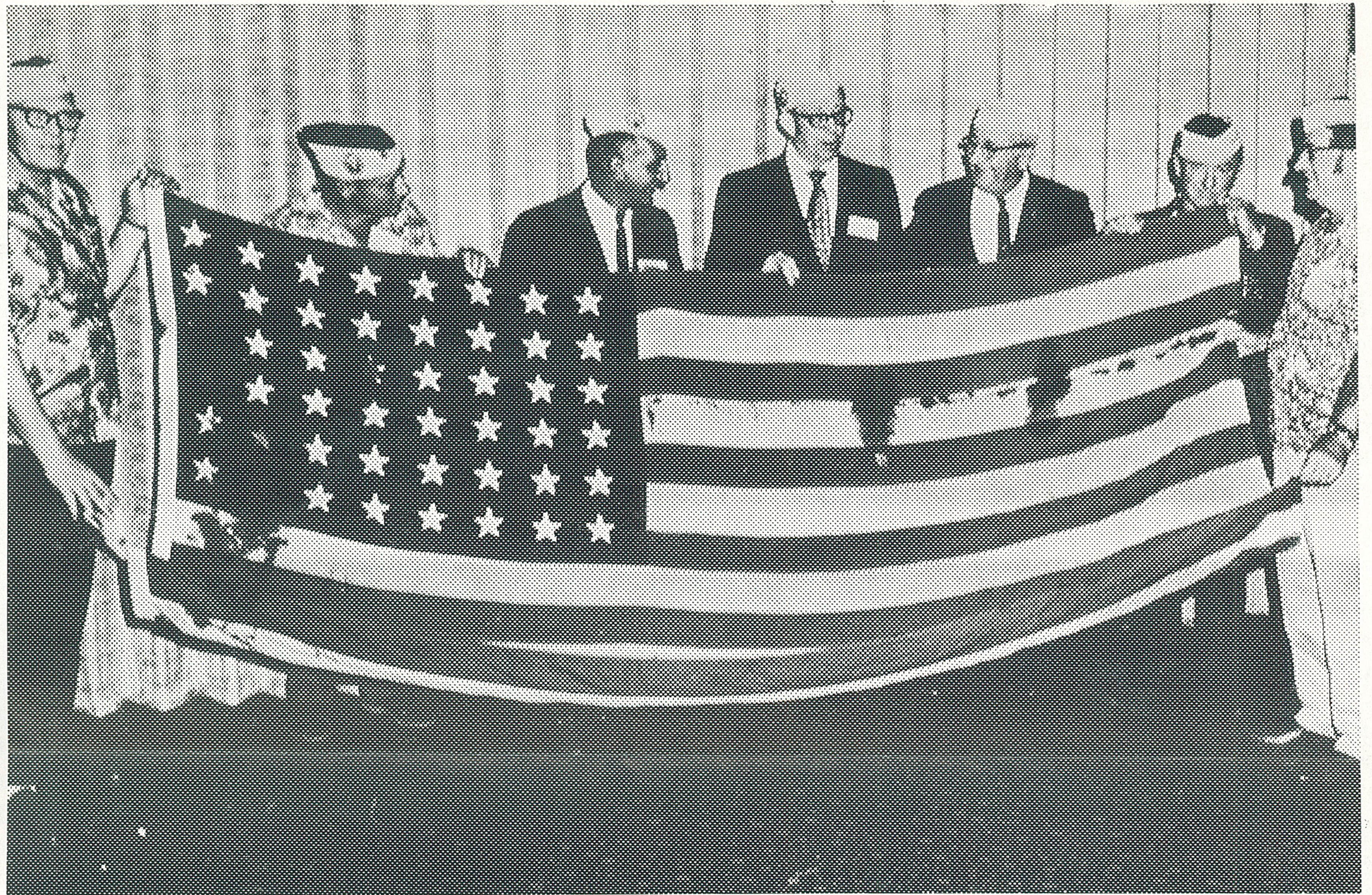
A standing ovation was rendered to Arthur Cunningham (USS Curtiss), California Convention Chairman, for a most successful 1969 California State Convention.

ARMY DOESN'T WANT

LAND FOR CEMETERY

The following article is taken from the Star-Gazette, Elmira, New York, dated Tuesday, September 16, 1969, and is published herewith for your information.

"Army Doesn't Want New Land For Woodlawn Cemetery"

"The Elmira Heights American Legion post is spearheading a drive for expansion of Woodlawn National Cemetery through federal acquisition of adjacent land now being offered free by the state.

The problem is getting the reluctant U.S. Department of the Army to accept the 23-acre tract of land between the cemetery and Elmira Reformatory.

Edward L. Gantert, adjutant of the Heights Legion, said the Department of the Army has closed out most veterans cemeteries, now retaining only the responsibility of maintaining them.

He said the department apparently wants no part of expanding any cemeteries.

The 23-acre tract of land has been offered free by New York State providing the federal government uses it for expansion of Woodlawn National Cemetery.

Gantert said Woodlawn is now closed to any new interments, with the exception of a very few plots reserved for Vietnam casualties.

"And we understand the only veteran cemetery now open is one in Long Island, which is a long ways away from here," said Gantert.

"We want to keep these cemeteries open because we feel there are a lot of veterans who are entitled to a military burial," said Gantert, who speaks for the Legion and other area veterans organizations who've formed the Veterans National Expansion Committee.

Among the other interested groups are the Catholic War Veterans and the Italian-American War Veterans.

The Heights Legionnaire, publication of the Heights Legion, has printed a letter asking people to write their Congressmen for support in getting the Army to accept the tract of land.

"We feel the veterans are being forgotten," the letter concludes."

MEMORIAL SERVICE

Registration fees are arriving daily for the PHSA 1969 National Memorial Service which will be held at Arlington National Cemetery, 12:55 p.m., Sunday, December 7, 1969.

Your check for payment of registration fees is to be made payable and mailed to George R. Sanner, Jr., National Memorial Chairman, Apartment 303, 6323 Landover Road, Cheverly, Maryland 20785. You will be sent a receipt soon as possible confirming the receiving and cashing of your check.

Please remember the deadline for registration is November 17th. After that date, the registration will have to be raised from \$20 to \$25 per person to pay for last minute arrangements.

Starting Saturday morning, December 6th, there will be a special check-in area located at the Mayflower Hotel. At this time you will receive your tickets for the cocktail reception, banquet, an bus transportation to and from Arlington Cemetery for the National Memorial Service. There will be no more additional cost of any kind in as much you have paid for the cocktail reception, banquet ticket and bus transportation in the original payment of the registration fee.

Your hotel reservation card should be mailed to the Mayflower Hotel, 1127 Connecticut Avenue N.W., Washington D. C. 20036, soon as possible. Reservations must be received by the hotel not later than two weeks prior to December 5th.

**FROM THE OFFICE OF
THE NATIONAL PRESIDENT**

Chapters or any PHSA member desiring to use the national insignia (PHSA Seal) must obtain permission from the National Office prior to using the insignia.

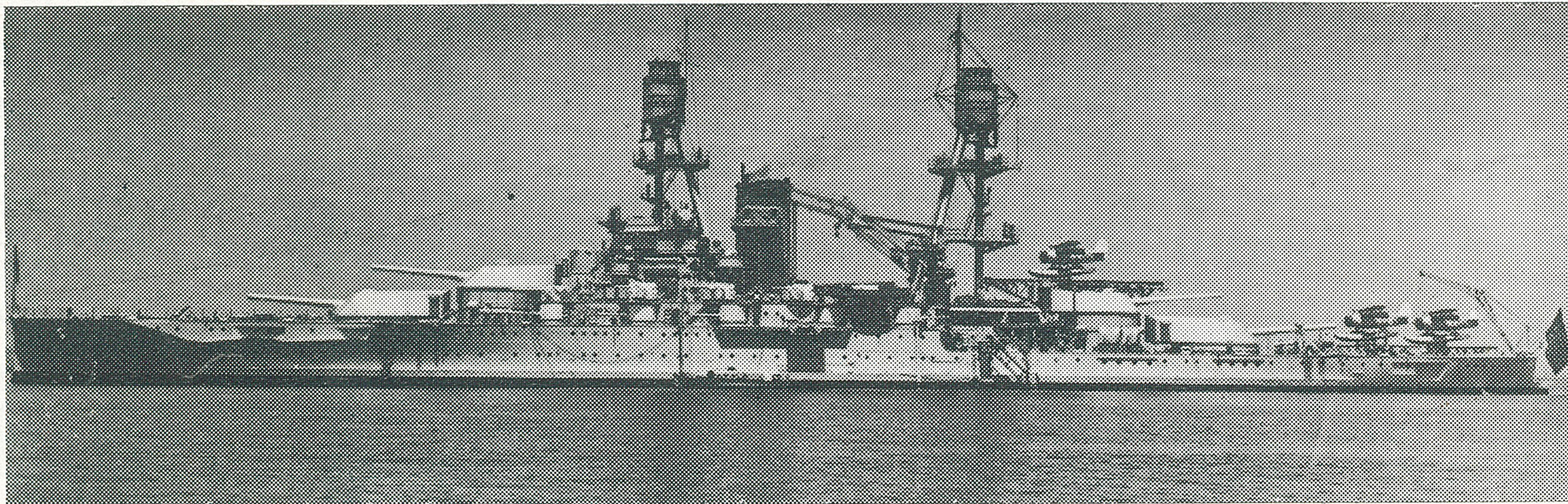

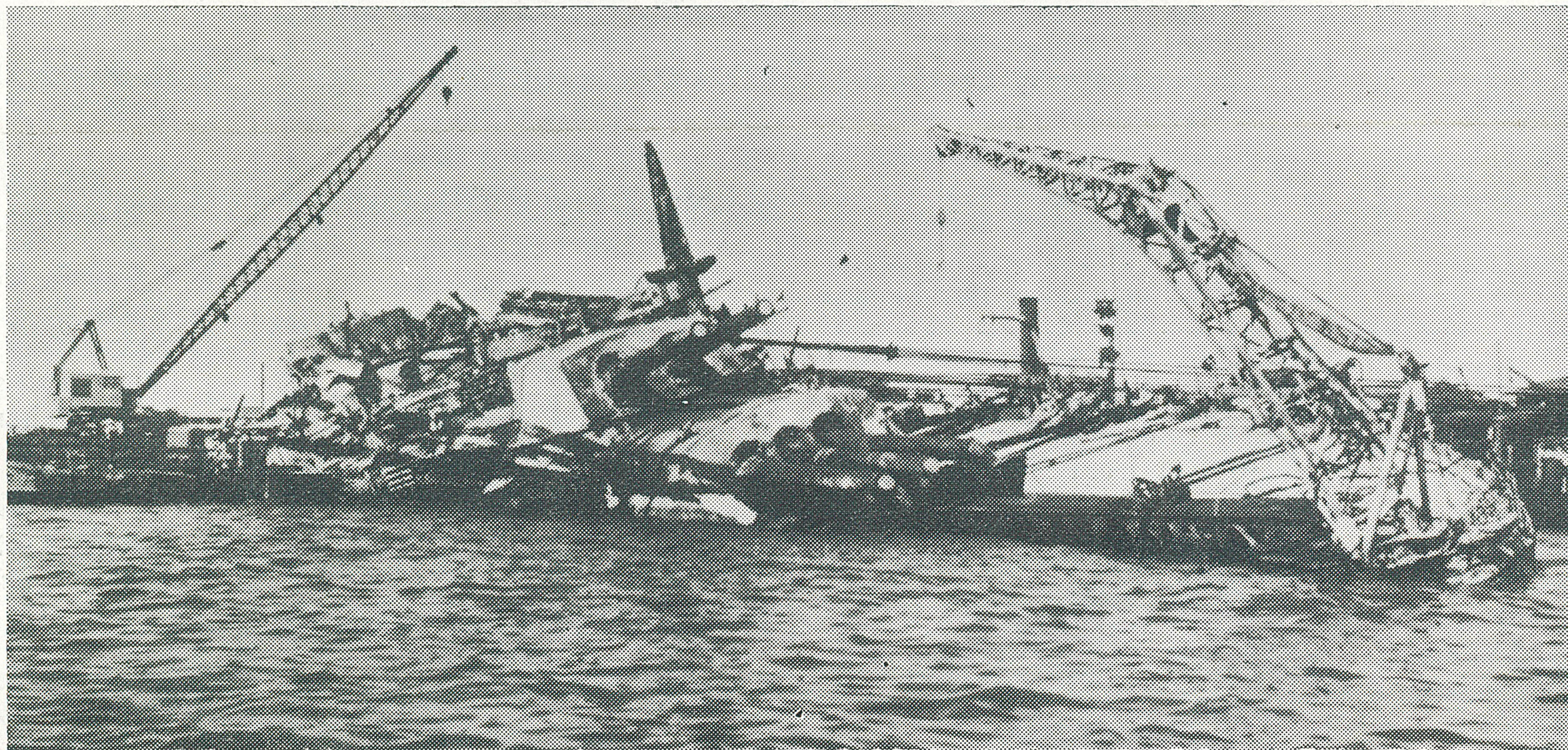
