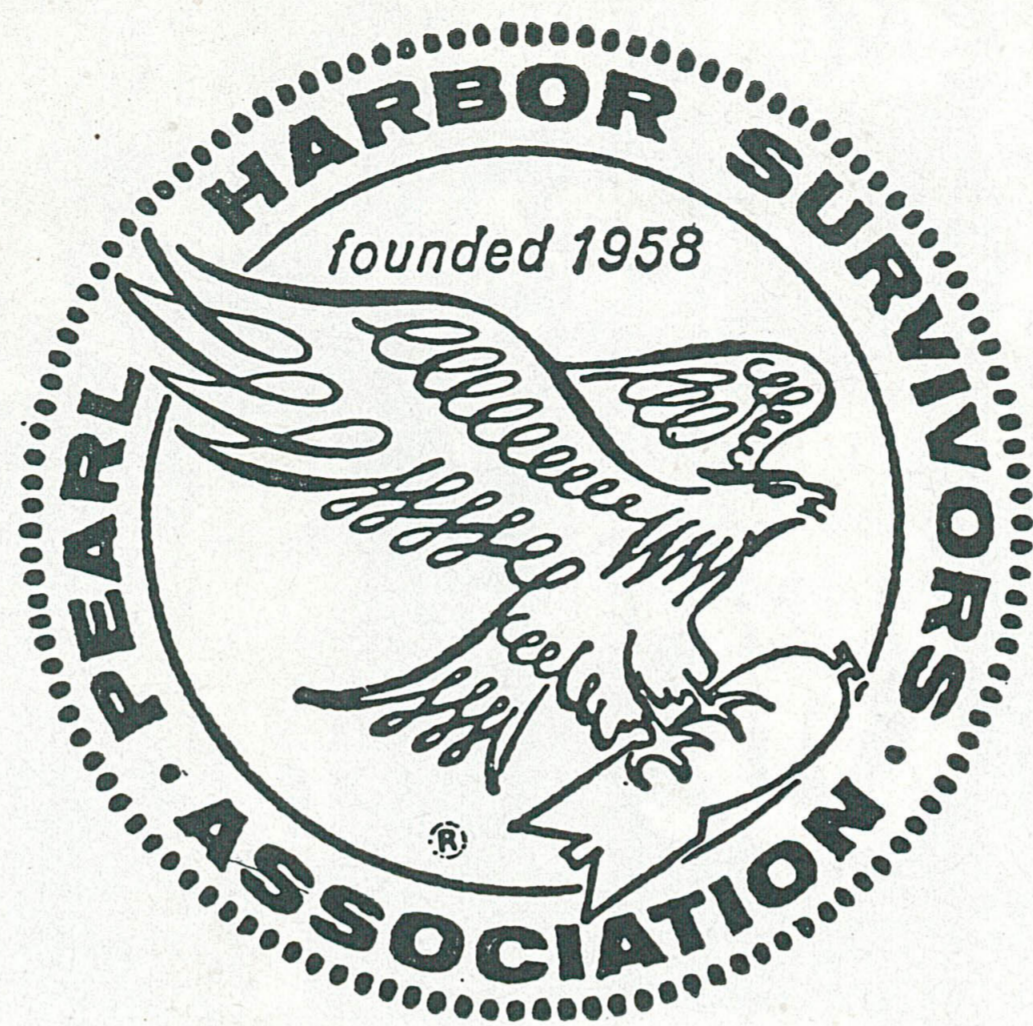

## FOR VICE PRESIDENT

Ralph "Kay" Krafnick of Minnesota has said that he will seek the vice presidency of the Pearl Harbor Survivors Association at the National Convention in New York in 1970 (this year).

Ralph has been approached by a number of fellow Survivors throughout our Association asking him to run because he is well qualified. He was the Minnesota State Chairman from 1964 through 1966 and during the 25th Anniversary at Honolulu he was elected the 5th District Director, and then re-elected in Seattle in 1968 to a second term.

When Ralph was appointed Minnesota State Chairman in 1964 by Gene Lindsey, there was little activity in that area, but he promised Gene that he would have four chapters active in one year - this was accomplished in only ten months. As you know, this takes a lot of hard work and time but

At the National Convention in Seattle, 1968, he was elected District Director of District No. 2. Ray is a real believer in PHSA and has been active over and above the requirements demanded by offices he held since first becoming a PHSA member. Ray holds a lifetime membership in the association.

good to me. It has given me an opportunity to meet and make new friends and renew old acquaintances, some of which were "lost" for 25 years or more. But, beyond that, I have seen the concerted efforts of PHSA members result in concrete evidence that support a contention I have always held - that the PHSA people are the finest people in the world. Which all goes to prove that by a unity of action, many things are possible for our association. I have yet to see a PHSA group undertake a task and fail in their objective. To me, this bespeaks highly of the caliber of the people in our organization."

Ray is very much aware of the responsibilities of the office of National President and in this respect makes a few comments.

"I have carefully considered the situation and the demands that such a position would place upon myself and my family. I have discussed this with quite a number of people; not only here in the Northwest, but in various parts of the country, including a very important person, my wife, who has given her approval. I might add also that my wife has been with me 100 per cent in all PHSA activities, a fact of which I am most proud. No man in his right mind would aspire to this office if he did not feel that he could or has, prepared himself mentally to do justice to the job. At this time, I wish to qualify my announcement as a candidate for the National Presidency. I make this announcement with full knowledge of the fine accomplishments of the men who served in this office in the past. These men have led us to where we are today - they have given us good and timely counsel - they have done their share, and more - they are to be highly commended. I have no axe to grind on past performance, our future success lies in looking ahead, not rehashing the past. Regarding the right to hold office and qualifications for such, may I say the right is for those who qualify according to our National Constitution and By-Laws; and, in my eyes, my past and present record must also be my qualifications."

Ray enlisted in October, 1938; did his boot camp at Great Lakes, and is a survivor of the USS West Virginia. He was a Gunners Mate 2/C at the time of the attack. He also served aboard the USS Reid (DD-369) and the USS Massachusetts (BB-59). On September 2, 1945, he left the Yokosuka Naval Base, Japan, where he had landed

Ralph said he enjoyed every minute of it. While serving as 5th District Director, Ralph has traveled to the states in his district where help was really needed, helping to form new chapters and trying to keep others active and alive. He said while traveling about his area, he has had some opposition from other survivor organizations. There are three of these in his area but, after talking to most of their leaders, Ralph has formed the opinion that in the near future all will be one.

At the present time Ralph has a bill in the hands of his congressman to help get our Association a much needed national charter, and with a lot of push from all Survivors, we may just get it. He says "No one gets nowhere doing nothing."

Ralph went through Great Lakes Naval Training Center in January 1938. His first ship was a four stacker "Tin Can" USS Wasmuth Next, USS Sands, another "Tin Can", and then to the USS New Orleans. Ralph left Long Beach in 1939 with the original HAW DET Detachment to Pearl Harbor. Ralph was in four major sea battles and in one of these the "No Boat" had her bow blown off. This is the only ship in the history of the U.S. Navy that ran into itself. The sailors off the USS Hull will verify this action because they helped us back to Tulagi. Ralph was later transferred to tanker duty and then back to "tin cans". His last ship was the USS Vesole (DD-878) which is still on active duty. Ralph was Water Tender and Machinist Mate. He retired from the service in July, 1959 as an E-8.

Ralph is a steam electric engineer for the State of Minnesota. He married his high school sweetheart, Renee. They have five children, Mike, Ed, Mary, John and Julia. Mike and Ed were both in Viet Nam and returned home safe and sound. The rest of the troop are still in school.

Krafnick belongs to the second largest VFW Post (428) in Minnesota. He has been named National Aid De Camp, Recruiting Class, three times by the National VFW Commander. He is in the chair for the second time and also went through the chairs as a Cootie, the honor degree of the VFW.

Ralph says he is a card holder in a lot of organizations and that he really doesn't belong to the PHSA but that the PHSA belongs to him.

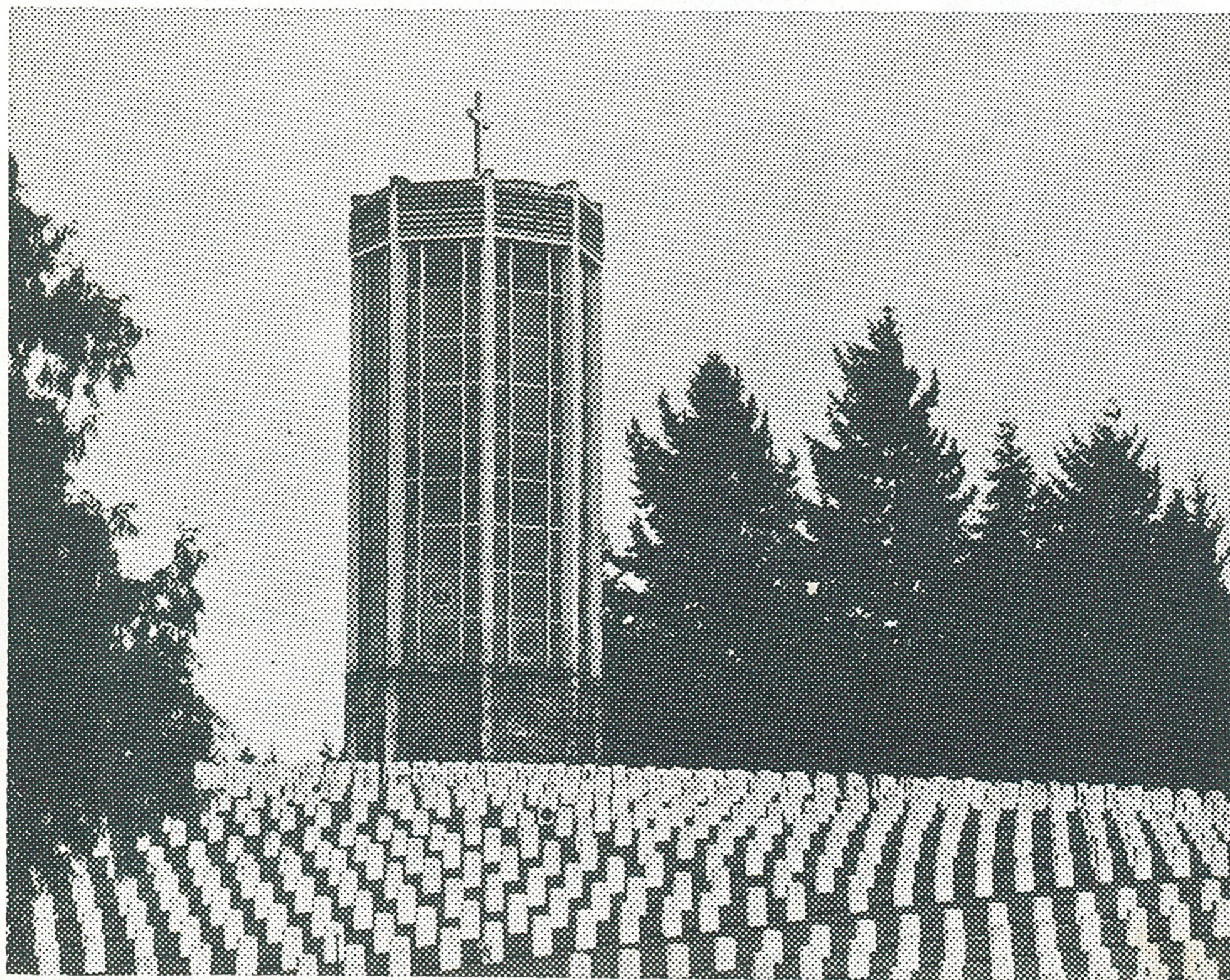
## GET-WELL CARDS TO JOE E. BROWN

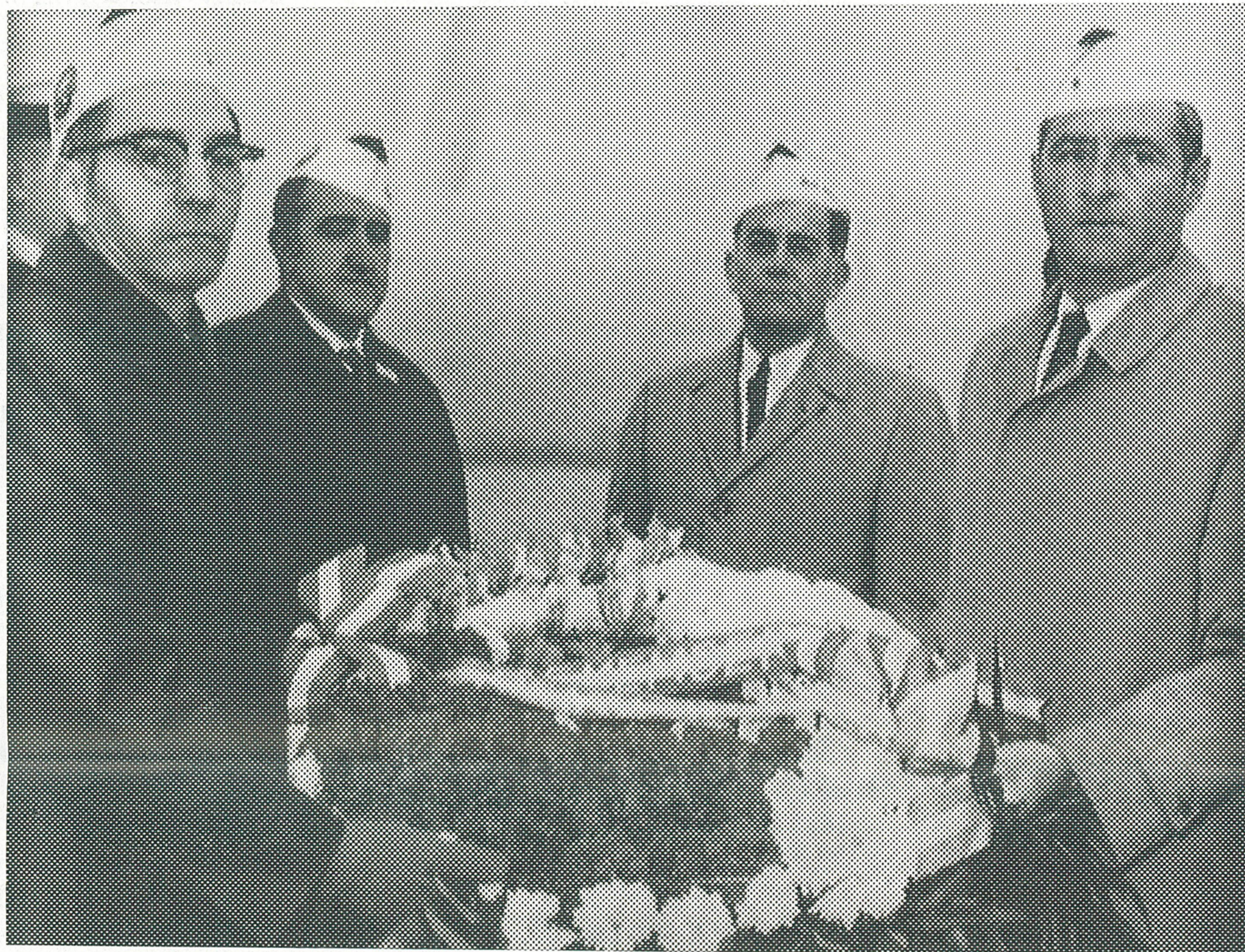

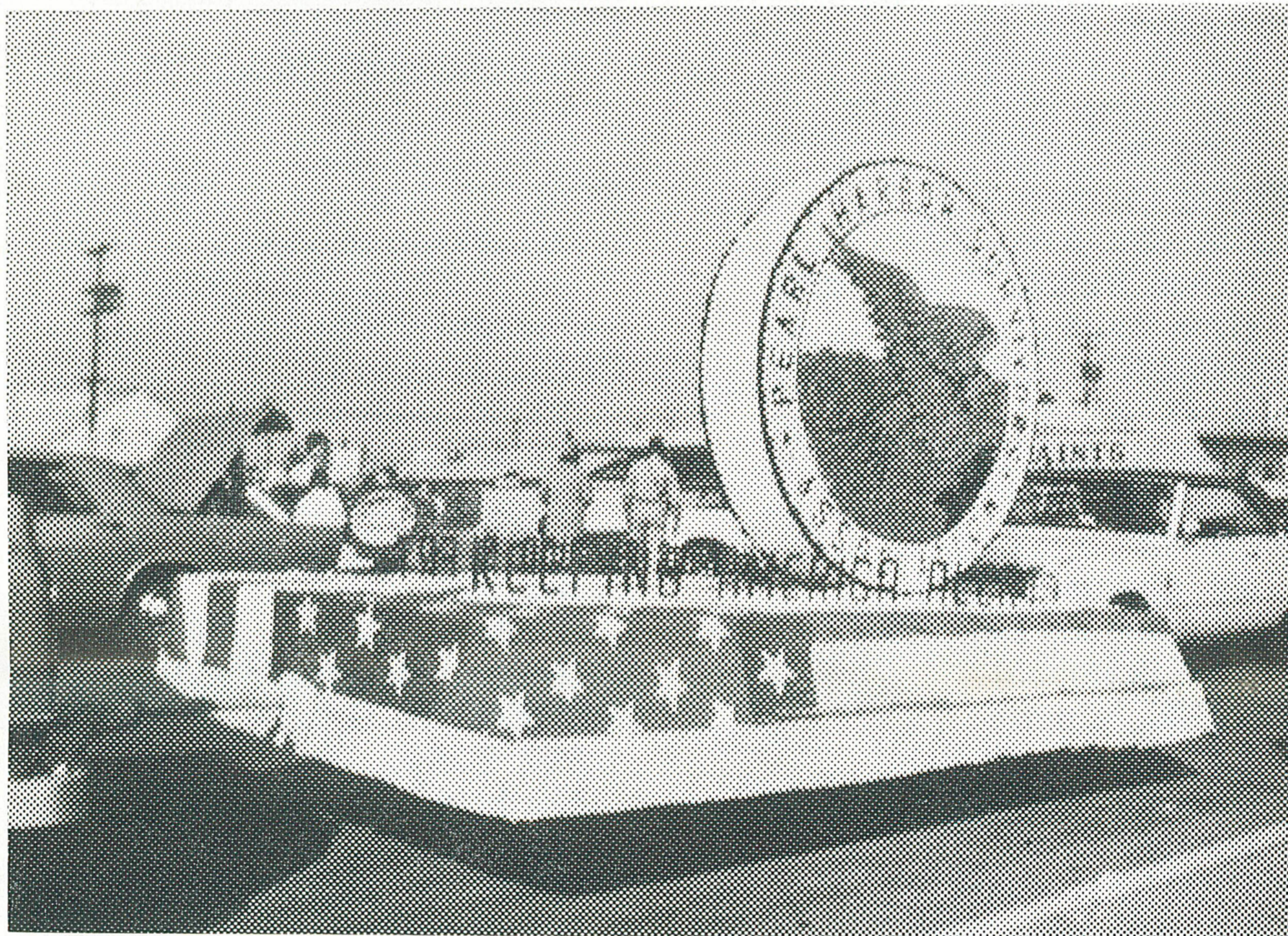
