

Hawaiian Islands — Paradise Of The Pacific

Mark Twain once described these isles as "The loveliest fleet of islands that lies anchored in any ocean".

The first Hawaiians are believed to be Polynesians from Samoa or Tahiti inhabiting the islands about 500 A.D. They had a religion based on gods that asked for human sacrifices, and their kings and priests were powerful. There was a complex system of taboos which made life difficult for the ordinary person. In spite of their harsh laws, they were gentle people, courteous, hospitable and kind. They loved dancing, singing and

story-telling.

Captain James Cook, British voyager seeking the Northwest Passage, was the first white man to discover these beautiful green islands in the year of 1778—landing on the island of Kauai. Captain Cook named the islands the Sandwich Islands—but the name was later abandoned. Cook was treated as a god when he arrived on the island. During his second visit in 1779, he went to the island of Hawaii. There his men were unfair in their dealings with the natives, a fight broke out and Captain Cook was killed on the beach while trying to get back to his ship.

PHSA MEMBER LOST IN CALIFORNIA QUAKE

Norman J. Stewart had just reported to work for the 6:00 a.m. shift at the Veterans Administration Hospital, Sylmar, Calif., when the Wednesday, February 9, 1971, earthquake struck in the southern California area around Los Angeles.

Norman's body was recovered Thursday from the wreckage of the ill-fated V. A. Hospital. A Los Angeles County Supervisor said it was the first hospital disaster in California history.

Norman was a survivor from the USS Hulbert.

He was a member of San Fernando Valley Chapter 12 and served as chaplain for the chapter.

Norman was an accomplished artist — he studied at the Chicago Art Institute and was a member of the Catherine Khulman Choir.

A military funeral was given in honor to Norman. He was laid to rest on Wednesday, February 17, 1971, at the Sawtelle Veterans Cemetery in West Los Angeles.

He is survived by his wife, Lillian.

The first king of the islands was King Kamehameha I, who was a just and wise king. When the old king died, drastic powers of the old religion died with him and many taboos were broken.

In 1820 the first group of missionaries arrived from Boston, Mass.—establishing a Hawaiian alphabet, textbooks, Bibles and newspapers printed in the Hawaiian language. Soon, Christianity became the national religion of the islands.

King Kamehameha II ruled from 1819 to 1824. With his wife he visited England in 1823 and died there of the measles.

King Kamehameha III ruled from 1825 to 1854. He had the queen of Kamehameha I as his regent—this started a practice of having a regent, usually a female, in each reign. A constitution, parliament, taxes and a criminal code were established.

King Kamehameha IV ruled from 1854 to 1863. He and the queen visited England where Queen Emma and Queen Victoria became good friends.

David Kalakaua, who won the election to the throne against

Queen Emma, ruled from 1874 to 1891. He signed a treaty with the United States in 1876 and had a fabulous coronation in 1883. A main shopping street in Waikiki is named for him.

Queen Liliuokalani (1832 - 1917) was the last of Hawaii's rulers. She was deposed so a provisional government could be established with the intention of achieving annexation to the United States.

This mother will go with the chapter members to Hawaii this December 7, 1971—30th Anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor".

Jerry further states "this has been a wonderful worthwhile project that cost nothing to the members or to the public, but time".

You are probably curious to know how many empty beer cans were collected to make the 5,000 pounds of aluminum. It took 115,000 beer cans.

Congratulations, Jerry, and to those who made the "project with a purpose" come true.

Martial law was repealed by President Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1944.

The U. S. Congress approved Hawaiian statehood on March 12, 1959.

On August 21, 1959, Hawaii officially became the 50th State of the United States of America.

This office has been advised that our Association's proposal for a Commemorative Stamp in honor of the 30th Anniversary of Pearl Harbor, December 7, 1941, has been placed on the agenda for consideration by the Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee. A joint effort by several people in PHSA is responsible for advancing the proposal to its present position. Additional Congressional and private support is now necessary and will help our cause a great deal. The importance of your individual efforts cannot be overly emphasized. Write your Congressmen and urge their support. Ask your friends to write, also. We want this stamp! DO IT NOW!!

Standards for the granting of Federal Charters to non-profit corporations have been received by this office. In agreement with these standards, a proposal is now being prepared for submittal to the Senate Judiciary Committee. As a point of information, these standards do not include a fee for the issuance of such Federal Charters. I have been advised that the Senate Judiciary Committee has not acted favorably on a national charter proposal during the last two Congresses. However, this shall not be accepted as a deterrent to our cause and every possible effort will be made for a successful conclusion to our proposal for a National Charter. A MARINE DOES IT!

Yes, this Marine has done it! He has recruited more than one hundred new members into PHSA. His award — a free round trip ticket to Hawaii.

Elmer Grayson was born September 24, 1921, lived and attended school in Mattoon, Ill.; then moved to Chicago in early 1940.

In July, Elmer received a Marine "Flag Waving" post card from a lifelong school buddy who had just joined the Corps. It had an impact on him — he enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps, July 27, 1940, and took his training at the Marine Corps Base, San Diego, California. He was selected to attend Sea School and upon completion of the school, he boarded the USS Saratoga for Pearl Harbor where he was assigned to the Marine Detachment aboard the USS Nevada on October 19, 1940.

Elmer remembers Dec. 7, 1941, "After breakfast, I had dressed

and was ready to go ashore on liberty when General Quarters sounded. I went to my battle station No. 7 broadside, casemate No. 7. My duty was a sight setter. We soon had to abandon gun No. 7, pulling out all of the gun powder because of fire coming in from gun No. 9 and continued fighting from gun No. 4. Being the only Battlewagon to get under way, the full impact of what was happening came to realization seeing the Arizona blown to hell as we were passing. After beaching at 'Nevada Point', the ensuing hours were spent carrying ammo and clean up and salvage."

A Commendation for his work in salvage of USS Nevada was issued to Elmer by Admiral Chester W. Nimitz, USN, February 23, 1942.

After spending ten months in the Naval Hospital, Seattle, Wash., due to injuries suffered in an accident, he received a medical discharge in January 1944.

On June 4, 1942, Elmer and his lovely wife, Vicki, were married. They have two daughters, Tanya Lynn English, age 27, and Marcia Joy Ferris, age 25. They have four grandchildren — Jeff and Stacy English, ages 6 and 3½, and Tori Lynn and David Ferris, ages 2½ and 1 year.

Elmer has been employed for 15 years for Conrad Charles at Con's Auto Parts (see Booster page) as his head counterman.

General quarters sounded December 7, 1941, at the time when Clair Jay Fox was ready to take his seat in the mess hall, aboard the USS New Orleans, to have his bacon and eggs for breakfast. Off to the bridge he went to man the sound power phones as he was the "Captain's talker."

Clair was born Nov. 10, 1917, at Centralia, Washington. Here he spent his first 21 years in this agriculture and lumbering town in western Washington going to grade and high school and working.

His naval career began Jan. 8, 1940 - when he enlisted at Portland, Oregon. He went aboard the USS New Orleans in August 1940 until May 1945, had duty with Commander, Western Sea Frontier and later saw duty in Agana, Guam, in the governor's office.

LIBERTY BELL CHAPTER

Clair was discharged from the navy in June 1947 with the rating of Chief Yeoman. Three months later, he enlisted in the Army Air Force, and retired June 1, 1970 with the rating of Chief Master Sergeant — completing more than 30 years of military service.

A few of the medals that Clair is entitled to wear includes the: Distinguished Flying Cross, Bronze Star Medal (non-combat), Air Medal, Air Force Commendation Medal, Outstanding Unit Award, AF Good Conduct Medal, Navy Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Philippine Liberation Ribbon, World War II Victory Medal — and many more.

Clair received his Bachelor of Arts Degree in Elementary Education from the University of Alaska, May 1970. He is presently employed by the Aurora Elementary School, Elmendorf AFB, Anchorage, Alaska.

VICE ADMIRAL
FREDERICK H. MICHAELIS

Vice Admiral Frederick H. Michaelis is the Deputy Director, Joint Strategic Target Planning Staff, with headquarters at Offutt AFB, Neb. In this position, Admiral Michaelis acts as the principal assistant and advisor to the director, who is the Commander in Chief, Strategic Air Command, in developing national strategic plans for the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

Admiral Michaelis was born in Kansas City, Mo., March 4, 1917. He attended Kansas City Junior College for two years prior to entering the U.S. Naval Academy in 1936. Upon graduation he served on the USS Pennsylvania from June 1940 until October 1942. At that time he took flight training, winning his wings in 1943. He continued as a Flight Instructor until March 1944 when he joined Fighting Squadron Twelve. He eventually assumed command of that unit.

He commanded Bombing Squadron Five until June 1946, when the Admiral returned to Annapolis for the Postgraduate School. He received his Master of Science in Aeronautical Engineering for the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) in August 1949.

The admiral served in Air Development including command of the Naval Air Special Weapons Facility at Kirtland AFB, New Mexico. In February 1954 he became commander of Air Group Eleven based aboard the USS Kearsarge. In July 1955 he reported on the Staff of Commander Air Force, Pacific Fleet as Special Weapons Officer.

In January 1956, he served with the Navy Department, Washington D.C. This was followed by an assignment as Executive Officer on the USS Randolph from May 1957 to July 1958. He then attended the Naval War College followed by

NATIONAL CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

At the National Convention in New York City, December 6, 1970, the following changes in our National Constitution and By-Laws were ratified.

Article V, Paragraph 4.j.

Furnish the National Association with a surety bond to cover all monies, bonds and securities handled, premium to be paid by the association (amount of which to be determined by the National Executive Board).

Article VI, Paragraph 2.c.

Call regular or special meetings of the Executive Board. The board shall meet or vote at least semi-annually. The board shall be permitted to vote on all issues using United States mail.

Article VI, Paragraph 4.a.

Issues involving the spending of all monies. The bond of the officers handling monies, bonds and securities to be raised to cover the gross amount of monies handled.

Article VII, Paragraph 4.b.

Must have been on station at the time of the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor or on the Island of Oahu, or offshore, not to exceed three (3) miles during time 0755-0955 as per application blank.

Article IX, Paragraph 1.a.

All State Chairmen shall be elected by the members of the respective states. Provided however, if there is not a qualified chapter in a State, then it shall be the duty of the National President on the recommendation of the District Director to appoint a State Chairman who shall serve in such capacity with all of the obligations and privileges hereinafter enumerated until a State Chairman is duly elected by the members of that State and that in the interim, any State Chairman appointed by the National President shall serve a probationary period of one year with option of the President to extend the appointment.

Article IX, Paragraph 2.b.2.

Shall purchase all stationery, insignia and other paraphernalia from the national office. Supplies bearing the registration mark or insignia of PHSAs must receive the written approval of the National Executive Board.

Article XVI - Adoption

This document was originally adopted at national convention on December 8, 1962, at Long Beach, California. Thence, revised at national convention in St. Louis, Missouri on December 6, 1963; revised at national convention in Clearwater, Florida on December 6, 1965; revised at national convention in Seattle, Washington on December 6, 1968 and finally revised and ap-




